Why did the toad cross the road?



Slow down - there are people and toads on the roads! The Fraser Valley Conservancy is monitoring the Western Toad Migration in the Ryder Lake Area. The migration of the juvenile toads includes a trek from the breeding wetlands to the forested upland across a busy intersection. Due to the high mortality rates during the migration, the FVC is overseeing road closures in the area. GCC makes tough cuts - [The Grasslands Conservation Council of BC \(GCC\)](#), a provincial non-profit dedicated to conserving BC's grasslands, has had to address their funding shortfall by cutting their education and outreach program and reducing remaining staff time by 20%. These measures will allow the GCC to stay functional until March 2011. "We've made great strides in grasslands conservation, especially over the past two years," says Bob Moody, Executive Director. "It's such a pity to go backwards now, but in order to stay afloat, difficult decisions had to be made."
