**Save Mary Lake** - The Mary Lake Conservancy was formed by a group of concerned District of Highlands residents that want to preserve Mary Lake and the surrounding forest land. With help from the Highlands Stewardship Foundation and the global eco-community, the Conservancy is working to save this carefully conserved and endangered Dry Coastal Douglas Fir ecosystem for future generations. To protect and conserve the beautiful Mary Lake property, The Mary Lake Conservancy must raise \$4.5 million – of which \$1 million must be raised by January 2011. Learn more [here](#).

## Funding Deadlines

**North American Wetlands Conservation Act Proposals, November 22** - NAWCA encourages partnerships to protect North America's wetlands as habitat for waterfowl and other wetland-associated migratory birds, fish and wildlife. It should be noted that the proposals must involve multiple partnerships and support the purposes of the Act. Projects must be coordinated through Tasha Sargent [tasha.sargent@ec.gc.ca](mailto:tasha.sargent@ec.gc.ca), Coordinator, Canadian Intermountain Joint Venture and Pacific Coast Joint Venture.

**[Interdepartmental Recovery Fund, November 22](#)** - To provide funding for

regulation amendment in Canada opens the door for cross-border conservation. On September 23 (as recorded in the Oct 13 Canada Gazette), the Canadian Government has accepted our application to be designated a "prescribed donee" under the Income Tax Act regulations. That means that gifts of land or easement to American Friends of Canadian Land Trusts (American Friends) will now not only provide a U.S. income tax benefit, but will be exempt from Canadian capital gains tax! Our cross-border land conservation is therefore in full gear, and we look forward to working with many of you to protect significant lands across Canada! ### **The Nature Trust is working to secure three properties along the Puntledge River in Courtenay on Vancouver Island**



- This project will involve an ecogift to The Nature Trust and requires \$145,000 for ongoing stewardship of the properties and developing a 5-year management plan.

The Nature Trust is working with the City of Courtenay to develop a greenway through these properties. Management activities will focus on maintaining the 500 metres of riparian habitat along the river as well as inventorying, monitoring and removing invasive species. ### **Environment Canada releases new water levels indicator**

- Water levels vary from year to year, based on location and weather conditions. Some areas of Canada have been drenched in water with prolonged rains this year, while other areas have experienced dry conditions. To shed some light on the state of water in Canada, Environment Canada's (EC) [Canadian Environmental Sustainability Indicators \(CESI\)](#) initiative has developed a new water levels indicator. This indicator provides a regional, national, and international perspective on how much freshwater Canada has.

**Environment Canada: Aboriginal Funds for Species at Risk, November 29** - For the recovery of species at risk on Aboriginal lands, supporting species recovery planning, habitat protection, and conservation and capacity-building-initiatives by Aboriginal people.

**Recovery of North America's Grizzly Bears Threatened** - A BC government decision on the future of North America's transboundary grizzly population is imminent. The Jumbo Glacier Resort, a 6,500 bed glacier resort and real estate development, has been proposed deep in the heart of the Purcell mountain range. Peer reviewed science by renowned grizzly bear researcher Dr. Michael Proctor confirms the Jumbo Glacier Resort would severely fragment the Purcell mountains, one of the continent's most critical trans-boundary grizzly bear corridors. 

**The Canada Revenue Agency's practices for ensuring that registered charities comply with the Income Tax Act are thorough** and the Agency is keeping the public informed, says Sheila Fraser, the Auditor General of Canada, in her Report tabled today in the House of Commons. "Canadians donate billions of dollars to Canada's 85,000 registered charities each year," said Ms. Fraser. "We are pleased to note that the Agency is doing a good job of administering the Income Tax Act as it relates to these charities." Read the full report [here](#).

**Regional District of Nanaimo taxpayers could soon buy the United Church Moorecroft Camp property in Nanoose Bay** - The regional board emerged from a closed-door meeting early November to vote unanimously to submit a joint bid with the Nature Trust of B.C. to acquire the property used as summer church camp since the late 1950s. The property is listed at \$7.95 million, but neither RDN staff members nor politicians will say what the bid will be. Read more [here](#).

**DFO restructuring emphasizes ecosystem management** - Under scrutiny because of a profound decline of sockeye salmon over the past decade, senior officials with the Department of Fisheries and Oceans testified Monday that the agency is undergoing major changes. Claire Dansereau, DFO deputy minister, told the Commission of Inquiry into the Decline of Sockeye Salmon in the Fraser River that her department is in the process of restructuring to put more emphasis on ecosystem management. **The Burrard Inlet Environmental Action Program (BIEAP) and the Fraser River Estuary Management Program (FREMP) are inter-governmental partnerships established to coordinate the environmental management of two significant aquatic ecosystems in the Lower Mainland of British Columbia - Burrard Inlet and the Fraser River Estuary.** The BIEAP office has a list of reports, studies and publications that are available to the public at no cost. **Environment Canada Releases Canadian Biodiversity: Ecosystem Status and Trends 2010 Assessment** - It is the first assessment of Canada's biodiversity from an ecosystem perspective. It presents 22 key findings derived from technical background reports. This 2010 assessment is a collaborative project of the Canadian federal, provincial and territorial governments. It forms part of Canada's commitment to the Convention on Biological Diversity. Authors and reviewers include hundreds of experts from across Canada. **Botany Night Pink Mountain Revisited: The conservation crises that no one is aware of, November 16th 7:30pm, Victoria (UVIC Elliot 167)** - Pink Mountain stands apart from its surroundings in the far North of BC. The summit supports an assemblage of arctic/alpine plants that simply does not occur anywhere else. Many of these plants are rare or at least are rarely seen and are never seen in the combination and numbers that are found on Pink Mountain. But now extensive industrial development (over 40 wind mill towers) threatens this unique habitat and it could all be lost within a year. Ron Long was a photographer at Simon Fraser University for thirty-six years. His interest in British Columbia wildflowers goes back forty years. Ron is a Vice-President of the Native Plants Society of British Columbia.
