

Invasion of the Giant Hogweed - Green thumbs may unknowingly be spreading — and contributing to the growth of — poisonous plants in Campbell River. The giant hogweed, a plant that can be extremely harmful to humans, has recently been spotted adorning some residential gardens. Cougar Annie's Legendary Garden is for sale - This is the homestead of Ada Annie Arthur, well known on the coast as "Cougar Annie's Garden". Cougar Annie carved out of her 117-acre parcel, 5 acres of garden in the wilderness of Boat Basin, 50 km northwest of Tofino. She raised chickens and goats, fed her family (she had eleven children), and started a mail order garden nursery from her garden. Wily and ingenious she also ran a general store, and post office from her home. She trapped and shot dozens of cougars for their bounty and became known as Cougar Annie.
